Welcome

Welcome to all our new and existing clients and especially those of you reading the Fairport News for the first time!

Roger's Ramblings

It has been great to catch up with a good number of our Eastern States clients on the telephone and to hear of their good fortune with the weather this year. Farmers in the eastern half of Australia have certainly been having much more fun this year than those on our side of the country, and more fun than they've had for a long time. I feel sorry for those of you doing it hard here in WA.

In the past few months we've been moving along with our software developments on several fronts. Mikhail (our mapping developer) has been working remotely from Russia on our precision farming module (FarmStar) rewrite. There is not much to show at the moment, but very soon his efforts will come together in a new release.

The Pocket PAM rewrite continues in earnest. We recently released a new product for Windows mobile devices in conjunction with AgIT called "AgMapper Scout". This is a combination of AgIT's popular AgMapper software and our newly rewritten gpsScout program. AgMapper Scout enables you to record geo-located crop monitoring and pest and disease observations then, using the AgMapper's built in capabilities, enables you to navigate back to the same locations to do further observations. Initially developed to satisfy the needs of the orchardists in Florida with their Citrus "Greening" disease, the program is potentially useful in any crop monitoring role. Once the data has been transferred back to PAM, map layers are automatically created showing the location of the observations.

Over the next few months all old Pocket PAM programs will be replaced by new ones. In theory the

new pocket PAM software could run simultaneously on the one Windows mobile device, but we will wait until all applications are finished before releasing the new version.

Also in these past few months Max Pro has been getting quite a lot of attention. Various enhancements to reports have been done and some general tidying up of screens, etc.

We are in the process of revamping the PAM backup & restore system and working on various fronts in readiness for a relatively major upgrade to PAM in the near future.

I have just returned from a great day at Albury with the senior management at Macquarie Agriculture. They are gearing up for an expansion into Brazil. PAM for Portuguese is all but ready for final inspection, thanks to our team (Fabio, Maximiliano, Anna and Demian) in South America.

Our Portuguese and Spanish web sites went live several months ago and we are getting a steady stream of enquiries from South America. Our agent in Argentina, Hernan Santiago, has been a huge help in getting the Spanish version of PAM ready. He is getting very keen at the prospect of showing it off soon to his clients in the wine growing regions of Argentina.

After many years of great service, Joanne Richardson (Farmtek) has left the world of farm software for the coast and boat building with her husband, John. Joanne started out as a fairport employee based from her home on the farm at Euroa, Victoria. After a couple of years we offered her the distributorship for Vistorai, South Australia, Tasmania and southern NSW. She carried out that role admirably and was well liked by all who dealt with her. We hereat Fairport wish her well for the future.

Paul Drendel and his partners at Capitis, Horsham have now stepped into the role of distributor for the areas previously covered by Farmtek. You can see Paul's contact details at the end of this newsletter.

Over the last 6 months or so we have been laying down some processes for data collection on a Courses are flexible and can be tailored to suit the prominent QLD beef producer who has 7 properties in all, 4 breeding properties and 3 finishing properties.

Using PAM Mid-Tier Enterprise, we are catering for livestock data management for the mob based management styles for all 4 breeding property managers whilst also catering for their 3 finishing property managers using both the mob base livestock diary and the individual animal records.

Although the PAM system is able to link the individual animal identities to the mob records, we decided to keep the individual separate in the software for this operation. On induction, animals are scanned and electronic ID's stored in separate electronic files on the computer. The file names used correspond to the source property, the age of the animal and the mobs in which they are placed. Having done this, there is no great need to scan the animals on every operation (such as veterinary treatments) as the treatment is carried out on the entire mob in which the animal belongs.

Due to the size of the operation and the size of the properties, the decision not to attach animals to PAM mobs saved having the hassles involved when one or more animals are lost, missing or unaccounted for during a move. When the animals are run through the race, they are scanned; the electronic ID is recorded as well as weight and any other trait that may be useful. On completion all of this information is imported into the PAM software for reporting purposes. This way we are able to get the full benefit of PAM's ADG reporting, the power of the "Trait Browser" and other reporting, filtering and and sorting features.

Using this system, we can determine how animals are performing with respect to their origin and also how they will perform into the future using the weight gain trends shown in the past. Animals are selected from the many thousands in the system using the files stored on induction to select the animals kept in each mob.

All AgIT courses are Farmready subsidised.
